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**AN ACT Relating to Lights on Boats.**

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Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

**R. S., c. 33, § 57, additional.** Chapter 33 of the revised statutes, as revised, is hereby amended by adding thereto a new section to be numbered 57, to read as follows:

**‘Sec. 57. Lights on boats. Every boat navigated upon any of the inland waters of this state, and not subject to the authority of the United States inspection laws, between the hours of sunset and sunrise shall show a white light of such character as to be visible on a dark night with a clear atmosphere, a distance of at least 1 mile and it shall be so constructed as to show a uniform light of 360 degrees of the horizon.**

**Whoever violates any provision of this section shall be punished by a fine of not more than \$10.’**
