**AN ACT Relating to the Taking of Clams and Marine Worms in the Town
of Searsport.**

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows :

Taking of clams and marine worms in Searsport. Any person not a resident of the town of Searsport, county of Waldo, or a riparian owner of clam or marine worm flats in said town of Searsport, is forbidden to dig or take clams or marine worms for commercial purposes within the limits of said town. A resident shall mean a person who has resided in this state for the term of at least 6 consecutive months, and in the town of Searsport for 3 consecutive months.

Any person taking clams or marine worms contrary to the provisions of this act shall be punished for each offense by a fine of not more than \$25, or by imprisonment for not more than 30 days, or by both such fine and imprisonment.
