STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED FIFTY-THREE

AN ACT Relating to Liquor Manufactured or Bottled in State.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

- Sec. 1. R. S., c. 57, § 6, sub-§ IV, amended. Subsection IV of section 6 of chapter 57 of the revised statutes is hereby amended to read as follows:
 - 'IV. To buy and have in their possession wine and spirits for sale to the public. Such wine and spirits shall be purchased by the commission directly and not through the state purchasing agent and shall be free from adulteration and misbranding. The commission shall in their purchases of liquors give priority, wherever feasible, to those made from the agricultural products of this state, and shall purchase and offer for sale in its stores, sufficient amounts of the liquors manufactured or bottled in this state to satisfy the consumer demand therefor.'
- Sec. 2. R. S., c. 57, § 6, sub-§ IV-A, repealed. Subsection IV-A of section 6 of chapter 57 of the revised statutes, as enacted by chapter 355 of the public laws of 1951, is hereby repealed.
