STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED FIFTY-THREE

AN ACT Relating to Admission Age for Maine School for Deaf.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

R. S., c. 23, § 171, amended. Section 171 of chapter 23 of the revised statutes is hereby amended to read as follows:

'Sec. 171. Admittance of children to school. With the consent of its parent or guardian, the department may admit to said school for a term not exceeding 12 years, any deaf and dumb child residing in this state and not less than $\frac{1}{2}$ years of age, who shall not be withdrawn or discharged from said school, except with the consent of the department or the governor and council, and the sums necessary for the support and instruction of such children while attending said school, shall be paid by the state.'
