**RESOLVE, in Favor of a Special Recess Committee to Study All Election
Laws.**

Special recess committee to study all election laws. Resolved: That a special legislative recess committee be appointed to study all election laws of the state, together with all related matters, and to consider and investigate the necessity, possibility and desirability of codifying and improving the election laws of the state. The committee shall, at the next regular session, make a written report, and shall include such recommendations for legislation as the committee may adopt, with a draft of such legislation. The committee shall consist of 2 members of the senate to be appointed by its president and 3 members of the house appointed by the speaker; and be it further

Resolved: That the committee shall meet as soon as practicable after appointment for the purpose of organization, including the election of a chairman and secretary; and be it further

Resolved: That the sum of \$7,500, from the general fund of the state, be made available to the committee to carry out the purposes of this resolve; and be it further

Resolved: That the members of the above-mentioned committee shall be entitled to \$10 per day and actual expenses incurred in the performance of their duties.
