RESOLVE, in Favor of Clyde Moores, of Springfield.

Clyde Moores; reimbursed. Resolved: That the sum of \$171.71 be, and hereby is, appropriated to be paid to Clyde Moores, of Springfield, to reimburse him for supplies furnished state paupers; said sum to be paid from the general fund of the state.

STATEMENT OF FACTS

For the period from December, 1936 to April, 1937, Mr. Moores furnished supplies to state paupers on town orders issued by the selectmen of the town of Springfield. Mr. Moores at the time was operating a general store and accepted the town orders in exchange for groceries and merchandise sold to state paupers. Subsequently, the town refused to cash these orders in addition to other items and in 1942 Mr. Moores brought suit against the town. For technical reasons, Mr. Moores failed to recover and the final judgment was for the town. Mr. Moores has exhausted all legal remedies and now presents this claim to the legislature for goods which he gave to state paupers on the authority of the selectmen of the town of Springfield.
