STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED FIFTY-THREE

AN ACT Relating to Free Hunting and Fishing Licenses for Indians.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

R. S., c. 33, § 32, sub-§ IX, amended. Subsection IX of section 32 of chapter 33, of the revised statutes, as revised, is hereby amended to read as follows:

'IX. The commissioner shall issue a hunting, trapping and fishing license to any Indian over the age of 18 years of the Passamaquoddy and Penobscot tribes without any charge or fee, providing the Indian presents a certificate from the agent of his or her respective tribe stating that the person described is an Indian and a member of that tribe on the census list. For the purpose of this section, an Indian shall be a person whose mother and father were Indians Holders of such licenses shall be subject to all the laws, rules and regulations of this chapter.'
