STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED FIFTY-THREE

AN ACT Prohibiting Employment of Females by Certain Liquor Licenses.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

R. S., c. 57, § 38, amended. Section 38 of chapter 57 of the revised statutes, as enacted by chapter 89 of the public laws of 1947, and as renumbered by section 9 of chapter 356 of the public laws of 1951, is hereby amended to read as follows:

'Sec. 38. Employment of minor and females. No licensee for the sale of liquor to be consumed on licensed premises shall employ any person unthe age of 21 years nor a female employee in the direct handling Θ , selling or serving of liquor on the premises where such liquor is sold except that the wife of the licensee, if she is of the age of 21 years or over, or a female licensee may be employed in the direct handling, selling or serving of liquor.

Whoever violates any provision of this section shall be subject to a fine of not less than \$50 nor more than \$100, or to imprisonment for not less than 30 days nor more than 6 months, or to both such fine and imprisonment.'
