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**AN ACT Prohibiting Employment of Females by Certain Liquor Licenses.**

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Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows :

**R. S., c. 57, § 38, amended.** Section 38 of chapter 57 of the revised statutes, as enacted by chapter 89 of the public laws of 1947, and as renumbered by section 9 of chapter 356 of the public laws of 1951, is hereby amended to read as follows :

**'Sec. 38. Employment of minor and females.** No licensee for the sale of liquor to be consumed on licensed premises shall employ any person under the age of 21 years **nor a female employee** in the direct handling ~~or~~, selling **or serving** of liquor on the premises where such liquor is sold **except that the wife of the licensee, if she is of the age of 21 years or over, or a female licensee may be employed in the direct handling, selling or serving of liquor.**

Whoever violates any provision of this section shall be subject to a fine of not less than \$50 nor more than \$100, or to imprisonment for not less than 30 days nor more than 6 months, or to both such fine and imprisonment.'
