STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED FIFTY-THREE

AN ACT Designating Presidential Election Day a Legal Holiday.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

R. S., c. 95, § 55, amended. The 1st sentence of section 55 of chapter 95 of the revised statutes is hereby amended to read as follows:

'No court shall be held on Sunday or any day designated for the annual thanksgiving; or for the choice of presidential electors; New Year's day, January 1st; Washington's birthday, February 22nd; the 19th day of April; the 30th day of May; the 4th of July; the 1st Monday of September; the day of the state election; **the day of the presidential election;** Armistice day, November 11th; or on Christmas day; and when the time fixed for a term of court falls on any of said days, it shall stand adjourned until the next day, which shall be deemed the 1st day of the term for all purposes.'
