STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED FIFTY-THREE

AN ACT Permitting Parole for Lifers After Thirty Years' Imprisonment.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

R. S., c. 136, § 12, amended. The 1st sentence of section 12 of chapter 136 of the revised statutes is hereby amended to read as follows:

'The provisions of sections II to 26, inclusive, shall not apply to any person convicted of an offense the only punishment for which prescribed by law is imprisonment for life, nor providing such person has never been involved in any other capital crime, but such person may be eligible to parole after serving 30 years' imprisonment. The provisions of sections II to 26, inclusive, shall not apply to any person convicted of an offense under the provisions of sections IO, II or I2 of chapter II7 or under the provisions of section 6 of chapter I2I.'
