**RESOLVE, in Favor of the Town of Canton.**

---

**Town of Canton; compensated. Resolved:** That there be, and hereby is, appropriated the sum of \$1,286.51 from the general fund to be used to repair or replace school equipment and supplies destroyed or damaged by flood waters in March, 1953.

**STATEMENT OF FACTS**

Canton is a small town with practically no industry. The Superintending School Committee is appealing to the Legislature for assistance in paying the costs of getting the Canton Central School ready for use. This town has suffered a loss from flood greater than it can bear and feels that to ask for half of this estimated cost would not be out of reason. The cost of labor for three men and a woman working continuously to clean out and disinfect the school, and the cost of some 30 gallons of Clorofen disinfectant, is in addition to other damage expenses.
