**RESOLVE, to Create a Special Committee to Study Safeguards in
Construction Projects.**

Committee appointed. Resolved: That a special committee be appointed consisting of 2 persons representing the construction industry and 2 persons representing employees in the construction industry, to be appointed by the governor with the advice and consent of the council; one member from the senate appointed by the president of the senate; and one member of the house of representatives to be appointed by the speaker of the house of representatives; the commissioner of labor and industry who shall serve as chairman; and be it further

Resolved: That this committee be empowered to investigate and study all accident factors in the construction of buildings, works or other projects with the objective to prevent accidents in such projects and to protect the worker and the public from undue hazards; and be it further

Resolved: That said committee make a report of its findings to the 97th legislature with any recommendations that it deems necessary; and be it further

Resolved: That the sum of \$1,000 be, and hereby is, appropriated from the general fund for the biennium ending June 30, 1955 to the said committee to be used for all necessary expenses of such study by said committee

including all necessary expenses of the members of the committee incurred in the performance of their duties.
