AN ACT Relating to Apprentice Barbers.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Sec. 1. R. S., c. 22, § 210, amended. The last paragraph of section 210 of chapter 22 of the revised statutes is hereby repealed.

Sec. 2. R. S., c. 22, § 211, sub-§ III, amended. Subsection III of section 211 of chapter 22 of the revised statutes, as amended, is hereby further amended to read as follows:

'III. Who has satisfactorily completed a course of instruction, of 1,000 hours in not less than 6 months, in a school of barbering approved by said board and a total experience as an apprentice of a period of at least 6 months under a licensed barber, or in lieu thereof has had a total experience in the practice of barbering or as an apprentice of 2,500 hours distributed over a period of at least 18 months.'

Sec. 3. Effective date. The provisions of this act shall become effective January 1, 1954.
