STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED FIFTY-FOUR

RESOLVE, Providing for the Shipping and Packaging of the Revised Statutes of 1954.

Emergency preamble. Whereas, the 96th legislature in regular session appropriated no funds for the packaging and shipping of the revised statutes of 1954; and

Whereas, it is in the public interest to distribute the 1954 revision to the people of Maine as rapidly as possible; and

Whereas, in the judgment of the legislature these facts create an emergency within the meaning of the constitution of Maine, and require the following legislation as immediately necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health and safety; now, therefore, be it

Handling of 1954 revised statutes; appropriation for. Resolved: That there be, and hereby is, appropriated to the Maine State Library from the unappropriated surplus of the general fund the sum of \$2,900 for necessary expenditures incident to the handling and distribution of the 1954 revised statutes in the fiscal year ending June 30, 1955.

Emergency clause. In view of the emergency cited in the preamble, this resolve shall take effect when approved.

STATEMENT OF FACTS

This sum is required for the following items:

Labor, supplies, advertising	600
