STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED FIFTY-FIVE

AN ACT to Appropriate Monies for Capital Improvements and Construction of State Government for the Fiscal Years Ending June 30, 1956 and June 30, 1957.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Appropriations for necessary expenditures of state government. In order to provide for the necessary expenditures of state government for the next two fiscal years—from July 1, 1955, to June 30, 1956, and from July 1, 1956, to June 30, 1957—the following sums or as much thereof as shall be found necessary, as designated in the following tabulations, are hereby appropriated out of any monies in the general fund unappropriated surplus not otherwise appropriated. It is the intent of the legislature that the items listed below shall be reconsidered by the Governor and Council on recommendation of the various department heads and that the appropriation to each department or institution shall be used to meet the most urgent needs at that time. Upon receipt of allotments duly approved by the Governor and Council based upon work programs submitted to the Commissioner of Finance and Administration, the State Controller shall authorize expenditures of these appropriations and revenues accruing thereto, on the basis of such allotments and not otherwise.

Any balances at June 30, 1956 shall not lapse but shall be carried forward into the following year to be expended for the same purposes. Any unencumbered balances at June 30, 1957 shall lapse unless sufficient evidence in the form of encumbrances is filed with the State Controller prior to June 30, 1957, showing that the project is in process, in which case all monies appropriated to the

project shall be carried to the following years to be expended for the same purpose until such project is completed, unless otherwise directed by the Legislature.
