AN ACT Relating to Sirens on Automobiles Operated by Sheriffs, Police and Fire Officials.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

R. S., c. 22, § 41, amended. The 3rd sentence of section 41 of chapter 22 of the revised statutes is hereby amended to read as follows:

'No signaling device shall be unnecessarily sounded so as to make a harsh, objectionable or unreasonable noise, and no bell or siren shall be installed or used on any motor vehicle except that fire and police department vehicles and ambulances, and vehicles operated by state, city and town fire inspectors ~~and~~, city and town fire chiefs, **assistant fire chiefs, police chiefs and assistant police chiefs** may be so equipped for use only when responding to emergency calls, and such motor vehicles used by **sheriffs and** deputy sheriffs, and such motor vehicles used by inland fisheries and game wardens as may be designated by the Department of Inland Fisheries and Game.'
