AN ACT Relating to Roadside Picnic Areas.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

R. S., c. 23, § 97, amended. Section 97 of chapter 23 of the revised statutes is hereby amended to read as follows:

'Sec. 97. Construction and maintenance of picnic areas, etc. The Commission is authorized to construct along state and state aid highways roadside picnic areas, roadside springs, scenic turnouts or other landscaping where in the opinion of the State Highway Commission it may seem advisable and place distinguishing signs upon the same; and the Commission is further authorized to use for the maintenance of the same such funds as are now available for maintenance of state and state aid highways. ~~The cost of constructing any one such project shall not exceed \$600, except that not more than 2 such projects may be constructed in any 1 year at a cost of not more than \$1,000 each.~~
