STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED FIFTY-FIVE

AN ACT Relating to Spot, Fog or Auxiliary Lights on Certain Vehicles.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Sec. 1. R. S., c. 22, § 43, amended. Section 43 of chapter 22 of the revised statutes is hereby amended by repealing the last paragraph thereof, as follows:

'The provisions of this chapter governing the equipment or use of front lights on motor vehicles shall not apply to motor vehicles owned or controlled by municipalities or village corporations and used for police and fire fighting purposes; or to motor vehicles operated by chiefs of police and by chiefs and assistant chiefs of fire departments.'

Sec. 2. R. S., c. 22, § 144, amended. The last sentence of section 144 of chapter 22 of the revised statutes is hereby amended to read as follows:

'This section shall not apply to ambulances, police and fire department vehicles, vehicles operated by state, city and town fire inspectors, to motor vehicles operated by chiefs of police and by chiefs and assistant chiefs of fire departments, vehicles engaged in highway maintenance, wreckers and public utility emergency service vehicles.'
