STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED FIFTY-FIVE

AN ACT Relating to Free Fishing and Hunting Licenses to Residents 75 Years of Age.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

- Sec. I. R. S., c. 37, § 39, sub-§ XII-A, additional. Section 39 of chapter 37 of the revised statutes is hereby amended by adding thereto a new subsection to be numbered XII-A, to read as follows:
 - 'XII-A. A license to fish shall be issued, free of charge, to every resident of the State who has reached the age of 75 years.'
- Sec. 2. R. S., c. 37, § 73, sub-§ VII-A, additional. Section 73 of chapter 37 of the revised statutes is hereby amended by adding thereto a new subsection to be numbered VII-A, to read as follows:
 - 'VII-A. A license to hunt shall be issued, free of charge, to every resident of the State who has reached the age of 75 years.'
