STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED FIFTY-FIVE

AN ACT Relating to Right of Way for Police and Fire Vehicles, and Ambulances.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

R. S., c. 22, § 92, amended. Section 92 of chapter 22 of the revised statutes is hereby amended to read as follows:

Sec. 92. Police and fire department vehicles and ambulances have right of way. Police, fire department, traffic emergency repair vehicles and ambulances, when operated in response to calls, shall have the right of way; and on the approach of any such vehicle, from any direction, and when such vehicle is sounding a siren or displaying emergency lighting devices, the driver of every other vehicle shall immediately draw his vehicle as near as practicable to the right-hand curb and parallel thereto and bring it to a standstill until such public service vehicles have passed. The person in control of a street ear shall also immediately stop said ear upon the approach of fire apparatus and keep it stationary until such apparatus has passed.'
