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**AN ACT Relating to Sirens on Motor Vehicles Operated by Department of Sea and Shore Fisheries.**

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Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

**R. S., c. 22, § 41, amended.** The 3rd sentence of section 41 of chapter 22 of the revised statutes is hereby amended to read as follows:

'No signaling device shall be unnecessarily sounded so as to make a harsh, objectionable or unreasonable noise, and no bell or siren shall be installed or used on any motor vehicle except that fire and police department vehicles and ambulances, and vehicles operated by state, city and town fire inspectors and city and town fire chiefs may be so equipped for use only when responding to emergency calls, and such motor vehicles used by deputy sheriffs, and such motor vehicles used by inland fisheries and game wardens as may be designated by the Department of Inland Fisheries and Game, and such motor vehicles used by coastal wardens as may be designated by the Department of Sea and Shore Fisheries.'
