AN ACT Relating to Weighing Vehicles by Officers.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

R. S., c. 22, § 110, amended. The 1st paragraph of section 110 of chapter 22 of the revised statutes is hereby amended to read as follows:

‘Any police officer may require the driver of any motor vehicle described in ~~section~~ **sections 36 and 109** to stop and submit to a weighing of the same by means of either portable or stationary scales. If such scales are not available at the place where such vehicle is stopped, the police officer may require that such vehicle be driven to the nearest public scales capable of weighing said vehicle and load if such does not increase by more than 5 miles the distance which said vehicle may reasonably travel to reach its destination.’
