STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED FIFTY-FIVE

AN ACT Relating to Speed of Commercial Vehicles.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

R. S., c. 22, § 107, repealed. Section 107 of chapter 22 of the revised statutes is hereby repealed, as follows:

'See. 107. Commercial vehicles; speed. No commercial vehicle equipped with pneumatic tires and registered for a gross weight of over 6,000 pounds shall be operated on open country ways at a rate of speed exceeding 40 miles per hour, or within the compact, built up portions of any city, town or village at a rate of speed exceeding 20 miles per hour; said ways and built up portions being defined in section +13; nor shall any commercial vehicle equipped with 2 or more solid tires be operated on said open country ways at a rate of speed exceeding 25 miles per hour or within said compact, built up portions at a rate of speed exceeding +5 miles per hour.'
