## STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED FIFTY-FIVE

## AN ACT Relating to Fees for Jurors.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

**R. S., c. 116, § 8, amended.** Section 8 of chapter 116 of the revised statutes is hereby amended to read as follows:

'Sec. 8. Fees. Grand and traverse jurors attending the superior court and jurors attending on any other occasion prescribed by law shall be allowed \$8 a day for their atendance, and 8c a mile for their travel out and home weekly, to be paid out of the county treasury. Such compensation shall commence on the day that the jury is called to such duty and shall continue without deductions for week ends until such time as the jury is discharged. In case the jury is recessed for 4 days or more the pay shall cease on the day that the recess is declared and shall resume on the day that the jury reconvenes.'

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
