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## STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED

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### **AN ACT Relating to the Salary of the Judge and the Recorder of the Portland Municipal Court.**

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Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

**Sec. 1. P. & S. L., 1891, c. 150, § 3, amended.** Section 3 of chapter 150 of the private and special laws of 1891, as amended by chapter 207 of the private and special laws of 1949, and by section 2 of chapter 157 of the private and special laws of 1953, is hereby further amended to read as follows:

‘**Sec. 3. Salary of judge.** The salary of the judge of said court (Portland Municipal Court) shall be ~~\$4,000~~ \$5,000 per annum, in full for all services.’

**Sec. 2. P. & S. L., 1887, c. 274, § 1, amended.** Section 1 of chapter 274 of the private and special laws of 1887, as amended by chapter 156 of the private and special laws of 1949 and by chapter 59 of the private and special laws of 1953, is hereby further amended to read as follows:

‘**Sec. 1. Salary of recorder.** The salary of the recorder of the municipal court for the city of Portland shall be ~~\$3,500~~ \$4,500 per annum, which shall be in full for all services, and it shall be the duty of said recorder to make and present all copies of libels and monitions in liquor cases.’
