AN ACT Relating to Height of Letters on Signs on School Buses.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

R. S., c. 22, § 48, amended. The second paragraph of section 48 of chapter 22 of the revised statutes is hereby amended to read as follows:

'All school buses, as above defined, shall bear upon the front and rear thereof a plainly visible sign "School Bus" in letters not less than $\frac{7}{8}$ inches in height which can be removed or covered when the vehicle is not in use as a school bus; but this provision shall not apply to public buses while transporting school children together with regular passengers. Such standard "descriptive signs" shall be furnished at cost by the Department of Education.'
