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**AN ACT Relating to Surveys by State Park Commission.**

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Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows :

**R. S., c. 36, § 34-A, additional.** Chapter 36 of the revised statutes is hereby amended by adding thereto a new section to be numbered 34-A, to read as follows :

**‘Sec. 34-A. Surveys. The State Park Commission, its authorized agents and employees may enter upon any lands, waters and premises in the State for the purpose of making surveys and examinations as it may deem necessary or convenient in the discharge of its duties under the provisions of sections 33 to 39, inclusive, and such entry shall not be deemed a trespass.’**

STATEMENT OF FACTS

The State Park Commission is directed by the provisions of R. S., c. 36, to study and ascertain the State’s actual and potential outdoor recreational resources. The agents and employees of the Commission should be protected against trespass action in the discharge of its duties.
