STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED FIFTY-FIVE

RESOLVE, in Favor of the Town of Bowdoin.

Town of Bowdoin; appropriation for. Resolved: That there be, and hereby is, appropriated the sum of \$1,023.50 from the general fund of the state to be paid to the town of Bowdoin in payment of bills owed by the town of Bowdoin for fire fighting services during the forest fires of 1947.

STATEMENT OF FACTS

The town of Bowdoin used or rented equipment and men from Crooker and Simpson, contractors, in attempting to prevent spread of the forest fires in 1947. A law suit was brought against the town of Bowdoin and Judge Arthur Chapman of the Superior Court passed down the opinion against the town and in favor of Crooker and Simpson in the sum of \$993.50, and the court costs would be another thirty dollars, making the total \$1,023.50.
