IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED
FIFTY-FIVE

AN ACT Relating to Local Option for Sale of Malt Liquor by Part-time Hotels.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Sec. 1. R. S., c. 61, § 2, sub-§ IX, additional. Section 2 of chapter 61 of the revised statutes is hereby amended by adding after subsection VIII, a new subsection IX, to read as follows:

'IX. Shall licenses be granted in this city or town for the sale therein of malt liquor to be consumed on the premises of part-time hotels only?'

Sec. 2. R. S., c. 61, § 2, amended. Section 2 of chapter 61 of the revised statutes is hereby amended by adding after the 11th paragraph from the end thereof, the following paragraph:

'If a majority of the votes cast in a city or town in answer to question IX is in the affirmative, the Commission may issue licenses for the sale of malt liquor to be consumed on the premises of a part-time hotel only therein.'

Sec. 3. R. S., c. 61, § 2, amended. Section 2 of chapter 61 of the revised statutes is hereby amended by adding after the 3rd paragraph from the end thereof, the following paragraph:

'If a majority of the votes cast on question IX is in the negative, licenses shall not be issued for the sale of malt liquor to be consumed on the premises of a part-time hotel that operates therein for the 2 calendar years next following.'
