STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED FIFTY-FIVE

AN ACT Regulating the Taking of Alewives in Georges River.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Taking of alewives in Georges river; regulation and penalty; exception. Whoever shall construct, set, maintain or use any net or seine in the waters of Georges river above a line drawn from Hooper's Point in the town of St. George, westerly past the northerly end of Caldwell's Island to a point opposite on the shore in the town of Cushing, for the purpose of taking or catching alewives between the 1st day of April and the 15th day of July, both days inclusive, shall be punished by a fine of \$50 for each offense; but nothing herein shall be construed to abridge or affect in any manner the rights and privileges now held by law by the town of Warren in the alewife fishing in said Georges river.
