AN ACT Relating to Speed Regulations for Passenger Buses.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows :

R. S., c. 22, § 113, sub-§ I, amended. Subsection I of section 113 of chapter 22 of the revised statutes is hereby amended to read as follows:

'I. Any person driving a vehicle on a way shall drive the same at a careful and prudent speed not greater than is reasonable and proper, having due regard to the traffic, surface and width of the highway, and of any other conditions then existing, and no person shall drive any vehicle upon a way at such a speed as to endanger any person or property. No passenger bus having a seating capacity of more than 7 passengers shall be driven or operated at a rate of speed in excess of 45 miles per hour, **except on highway posted for a higher rate of speed.** No person shall operate any motor drive cycle at any time mentioned in section 136 at a speed greater than 35 miles per hour unless such motor driven cycle is equipped with a headlamp or lamps which are adequate to reveal a person or vehicle at a distance of 300 feet ahead.'
