STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED FIFTY-FIVE

AN ACT Relating to Instruction in Schools of Barbering.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

R. S., c. 25, § 222, amended. The 1st sentence of section 222 of chapter 25 of the revised statutes is hereby amended to read as follows:

'No school of barbering shall be approved by the Board until it shall attach to its staff a physician duly licensed to practice medicine in the State where the school is located who shall instruct the students by lectures or demonstrations at least twice but not more than 4 times during the course on subjects of sanitation, steriliaztion, general anatomy and diseases, nor unless it has a minimum requirement of continuous course of study of ±,000 hours distributed over a term of not less than 6 9 months, including practical demonstrations, written or oral tests and theoretical and practical instruction in sanitation, fundamentals for barbering, hygiene, histology of the hair, skin, face and neck, diseases of the skin, hair, glands and nails, massaging and manipulating the muscles of the upper body, hair cutting, shaving, and arranging, dressing, coloring, bleaching, tinting the hair sterilization and the use of antiseptics, cosmetics and electrical appliances customarily used in the practice of barbering, which course of study and instruction shall be subject to the approval of said Board.'
