## STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED FIFTY-FIVE

AN ACT Relating to Compensation and Inspections of State Board of Barbers and Hairdressers.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Sec. 1. R. S., c. 25, § 213, amended. The 5th and 6th paragraphs of section 213 of chapter 25 of the revised statutes are hereby amended to read as follows:

'Each member of the Board shall be allowed the sum of \$10 \$20 per day and their necessary traveling expenses for actual attendance upon any examination of candidates for registration, and for any necessary hearings and board meetings.

The executive secretary of said Board shall keep a record of all proceedings, issue all notices, certificates of registration and licenses, attest all such papers and order as said Board shall direct, make sanitary inspections at least once twice a year of shops and other establishments subject to license under the provisions of sections 213 to 230, inclusive, and perform such other duties as shall be designated by the Board.'

Sec. 2. R. S., c. 25, § 213, amended. The 2nd paragraph of section 213 of chapter 25 of the revised statutes is hereby amended to read as follows:

"The chief clerk of the Board shall be paid a salary not in excess of \$500 per year, subject to the approval of the Governor and Council, to be paid from funds received under the provisions of sections 213 to 230, inclusive. Such salary shall be in addition to any other compensation received for any other positions which may be held by such clerk."
