STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED

AN ACT Relating to Registration for Barbers and Apprentice Barbers.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Sec. 1. R. S., c. 25, § 219, sub-§ I, amended. Subsection I of section 219 of chapter 25 of the revised statutes is hereby amended to read as follows:

I. Who is at least ~~18~~ 17 years of age;

Sec. 2. R. S., c. 25, § 219, sub-§ III, amended. Subsection III of section 219 of chapter 25 of the revised statutes is hereby amended to read as follows:

III. Who has satisfactorily completed a course of instruction, of ~~1,000~~ 1,500 hours in not less than 6 9 months, in a school of barbering approved by said Board ~~and a total experience as an apprentice of a period of at least 6 months under a licensed barber,~~ or in lieu thereof has had a total experience in the practice of barbering or as an apprentice of ~~2,500~~ 3,000 hours distributed over a period of at least 18 months.'

Sec. 3. R. S., c. 25, § 223, amended. Section 223 of chapter 25 of the revised statutes is hereby amended by adding thereto a new paragraph, to read as follows:

'No apprentice barber shall be permitted to hold an apprentice license for longer than 24 months.'
