AN ACT Relating to Binding of Logs and Lumber on Motor Vehicles.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

R. S., c. 22, § 95, amended. The last sentence of section 95 of chapter 22 of the revised statutes is hereby amended to read as follows:

‘Said chains shall be made of not less than $\frac{3}{8}$ of an inch wire, **or $\frac{5}{16}$ of an inch wire having a breaking strength of 7,500 lbs., such wire to be stamped by the manufacturer as having such breaking strength every fifth length,** and said chains and binders shall be held firmly in place and properly spaced to secure the load.’
