# IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED FIFTY-FIVE

#### AN ACT Relating to the Board of Finance of the City of Lewiston.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

- Sec. 1. P. & S. L., 1939, c. 8, Art. II, § 1, amended. The 1st sentence of section 1 of article II of chapter 8 of the private and special laws of 1939 is hereby amended to read as follows:
- 'An election shall be held on the 3rd Monday in February of each year, at which the qualified voters of the city shall ballot for a mayor and members of the board of finance, and the qualified voters of each ward shall ballot for a member of the board of aldermen, a warden, and a ward clerk.'
- Sec. 2. P. & S. L., 1939, c. 8, Art. VIII, §§ 1 and 2, repealed and replaced. Sections 1 and 2 of article VIII of chapter 8 of the private and special laws of 1939 are hereby repealed and the following enacted in place thereof:
- 'Sec. 1. Members of board of finance. The board of finance shall consist of 3 members, to be elected for a term of 3 years or until their successors have been elected and qualified; except that at the time of the election of the first board under the provisions of this act, the one receiving the greatest number of votes shall serve for 3 years, the one receiving the 2nd greatest number of votes shall serve for 2 years and the one receiving the 3rd greatest number of votes shall serve for 1 year; and thereafter, at each annual election, one member shall be elected for 3 years. Each member of the board shall receive an annual salary of \$800. Members of the board shall elect its own chairman.
- Sec. 2. Vacancies. Any vacancy occurring in the board shall be filled by a special election to be held not later than 6 weeks after such vacancy occurs.'
