STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED FIFTY-FIVE

AN ACT Relating to Sales of Malt Liquor to Minors.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

R. S., c. 61, § 51, amended. The 2nd and 3rd sentences of the 2nd paragraph of section 51 of chapter 61 of the revised statutes are hereby amended to read as follows:

'No licensee, by himself, clerk, servant or agent entitled to sell malt liquor not to be consumed on the premises shall sell, furnish, give or deliver such malt liquor to any person visibly intoxicated, to any insane person, to a known habitual drunkard, to any pauper, to persons of known intemperate habits or to any minor under the age of 24 18 years. No licensee by himself, clerk, servant or agent shall sell, furnish, give, serve or permit to be served any liquor to be consumed on the premises to any person visibly intoxicated, to any insane person, to a known habitual drunkard, to any pauper, to persons of known intemperate habits or to any minor under the age of 24 18 years.'
