IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED FIFTY-FIVE

RESOLVE, Authorizing the Forest Commissioner to Convey Certain Interest of the State in an Island in Kennebec County.

Authorizing Forest Commissioner to convey certain land. Resolved: That the Forest Commissioner be, and hereby is, authorized and directed to convey the interest of the State, in and to, a certain island in Great Pond, in the county of Kennebec and State of Maine, situate westerly of Jamaica Point, so-called, in said lake, and known as Crooked Island, to Paris L. Mosher of Rome, upon payment to the Treasurer of the State of the sum of \$50, or the highest bidder therefor.

STATEMENT OF FACTS

Paris L. Mosher is the owner of the westerly half of Jamaica Point, in Great Pond, off whose shore Crooked Island is situate, said island being 75 feet wide at its widest point, and containing approximately one-half acre. Mr. Mosher and his father had thought they owned it and paid taxes on it, but learned of the State's ownership, it being situate in a Great pond.
