STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED FIFTY-FIVE

AN ACT Providing for Permits to Operate Vehicles on Part of Route 16 with Extra Weight When Loaded with Pulpwood, Logs or Bolts.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Permits to operate vehicles on part of route 16 with extra weight when loaded with pulpwood, logs or bolts; fees. Jurisdiction is vested in the State Highway Commission to grant, with respect to any vehicle duly registered under section 19 of chapter 22 of the Revised Statutes of 1954 for a gross weight of not less than 48,000 pounds, a permit to operate the same, for any period of time which does not extend beyond the time covered by such registration, on that part of the highway designated as Route 16 which extends from the boundary line of the State approximately 10 miles to the nearest point on said highway to Lake Aziscoos, with a gross weight exceeding the gross weight for which such vehicle is so registered by not more than 5,000 pounds when loaded entirely with pulpwood, logs or bolts. Operation in accordance with, within the limits of and under any such permit shall not be deemed to be in violation of any of the provisions of sections 19, 36, 109, 110 and 111 of chapter 22 of the Revised Statutes relating to weights of vehicles, weights of loads, tonnages or overloads. The fee for such permit shall be \$25 for each 6 months or fraction of 6 months of the term thereof, and shall be paid to the Secretary of State before such permit is issued.
