RESOLVE, Providing for Survey of Railroad Crossings on College Avenue in City of Waterville.

Survey of Railroad Crossings in Waterville; provided for. Resolved: That the sum of \$35,000 be appropriated from the general highway fund for the purpose of obtaining an engineering survey of the proposed elimination of railroad crossings on College Avenue in Waterville.

STATEMENT OF FACTS

Preliminary surveys indicate that from 3 to 6 crossings in Waterville with an annual daily traffic count of from 1,000 to 14,000 can be eliminated. This survey would provide complete engineering detail, including cost estimates. Cost of construction would be borne 90% by the federal government and 10% by the railroad, both of which are interested in the problem. City of Waterville has appropriated \$5,000 toward cost of the survey, and this resolve would provide remaining estimated cost. Town of Fairfield town meeting will also consider contributing to cost.
