RESOLVE, Requesting Judicial Council to Study Certain Problems.

Judicial Council to make study; request for. Resolved: That the Judicial Council, whose duties are prescribed by the provisions of the Revised Statutes of 1954, Chapter 113, Section 195, be and hereby is requested to study the desirability of removing domestic relations problems from the jurisdiction of the Superior Court and placing the same under the jurisdiction of Probate Courts, or elsewhere; to study the desirability of creating a District Court system integrating the activities of the present municipal court and trial justice system, and to study the desirability of a state-wide uniform probation and parole system; and be it further

Resolved: That the said Judicial Council prepare specific legislative proposals for presentation to the 98th Maine Legislature, designed to reflect its conclusions, if any, with respect to the aforesaid subjects of domestic relations, municipal court system and probation and parole system.
