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**RESOLVE, in Favor of Abigail D. Flynn, of Waldoboro.**

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**Abigail D. Flynn; compensated. Resolved:** That there be, and hereby is, appropriated from the general highway fund the sum of \$350 to be paid to Abigail D. Flynn, of Waldoboro, as a full and final settlement for her claim against the State, for reconstructing and replacing sewer of 130 feet, including the pipe and fittings, damage caused by the construction of the highway under the supervision of the State Highway Commission in March 1951; said amount to cover the expense of replacement of said sewer.

STATEMENT OF FACTS

On March 25, 1951, the A. P. Wyman, Inc. of Waterville, Maine, reconstructed the highway known as Route 220 leading from Waldoboro to Friendship. During said construction the A. P. Wyman, Inc. being employed by the State of Maine and under the State Highway Commission to reconstruct said highway, and while the highway was being constructed the blasting ruined the sewer of the Abigail D. Flynn property. An estimate of the cost of replacing this sewer, which distance is approximately 130 feet, estimate being made by Fred Harris, manager of the Waldoboro Water Company, is \$350; pipe and fittings \$125, digging up the street and laying sewer, hauling off excess material and replacing with gravel \$225. There is no sewer connection on the Flynn property at the present time.
