**AN ACT Relating to Free Tolls over Deer Isle-Sedgwick Bridge.**

---

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

**P. & S. L., 1935, c. 88, § 9, amended.** Section 9 of chapter 88 of the private and special laws of 1935, as repealed and replaced by section 4 of chapter 20 of the private and special laws of 1939 and amended by section 1 of chapter 195 of the private and special laws of 1949, is hereby further amended by adding after the 3rd sentence, 3 new sentences to read as follows:

**'All persons going to or from public worship on the Lord's Day may pass over the bridge (Deer Isle-Sedgwick) free of toll. Every such person shall give to the toll collector his name and residence. Whoever refuses or omits to do so, or willfully renders a false answer, and thereby evades the payment of his legal toll, shall be punished by a fine of not less than \$10.'**
