STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED FIFTY-FIVE

AN ACT Relating to Interstate Shipment of Clams.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

R. S., c. 38, § 91, amended. The 1st paragraph of section 91 of chapter 38 of the revised statutes is hereby amended to read as follows:

'No person, firm or corporation, as principal or by an agent or servant, shall ship or transport or attempt to ship or transport, in any manner beyond the limits of this State, any soft-shell clams in the shell; except that holders of licenses under the provisions of this section and section III may ship or transport, by common carrier licensed by the interstate commerce commission, such clams in hermetically sealed cans containing no more than 3 dozen of such clams or in individual lots of not more than $\frac{1}{2}$ bushel of such clams to any one customer in any one day; such individual lots of not more than $\frac{1}{2}$ bushel of such clams shall not be shipped beyond the limits of the State during the months of June, July, August and September.'
