IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED
FIFTY-FIVE

AN ACT Regulating the Taking of Clams in the Town of Penobscot.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Taking of clams in town of Penobscot, Hancock county, regulated. Any person not a resident of the town of Penobscot, Hancock county, is forbidden to dig more than $\frac{1}{2}$ bushel of clams in any one day and not exceeding one bushel in any one week within the limits of said town.

Whoever violates any provisions of this act shall be punished by a fine of not more than \$25, or by imprisonment for not more than 30 days, or by both such fine and imprisonment.
