IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED

AN ACT Relating to Fees of Town Clerks in Recording Copies of Instruments.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

R. S., c. 91, § 28, amended. The 3rd paragraph from the end of section 28 of chapter 91 of the revised statutes is hereby amended to read as follows:

'The clerks shall receive for receiving and recording any instrument by law entitled to be recorded, including any assignment attached thereto or made a part thereof and executed before record and received with such instrument, the sum of \$1 for the first 500 words and the sum of 25c for each 100 words or fraction thereof in excess of 500 words; provided, however, if the instrument to be recorded does not exceed in length 250 words, the fee for recording the same shall be 50c, and if the instrument to be recorded does exceed 250 words, the fee for recording a copy thereof shall be \$1.'
