**AN ACT Increasing Salaries of the Judge and Recorder of the Town of Lincoln
Municipal Court.**

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows :

Sec. 1. P. & S. L., 1947, c. 85, § 1, amended. The last sentence of the 2nd paragraph of section 1 of chapter 85 of the private and special laws of 1947, as last amended by section 1 of chapter 158 of the private and special laws of 1951, is hereby further amended to read as follows :

'His salary shall be ~~\$2,000~~ \$2,300 a year, beginning January 1, ~~1951~~ 1955, to be paid monthly from the treasury of the county of Penobscot.'

Sec. 2. P. & S. L., 1947, c. 85, § 1, amended. The 3rd sentence of the 3rd paragraph of section 1 of chapter 85 of the private and special laws of 1947, as last amended by section 2 of chapter 57 of the private and special laws of 1953, is hereby further amended to read as follows :

'His salary shall be ~~\$1,000~~ \$1,200 a year, to be paid monthly from the treasury of the county of Penobscot.'

Sec. 3. P. & S. L., 1947, c. 85, § 1, amended. Section 1 of chapter 85 of the private and special laws of 1947, as amended by chapter 158 of the private and special laws of 1951 and by section 2 of chapter 57 of the private and special laws of 1953, is hereby further amended by adding at the end of the 2nd paragraph thereof a new sentence to read as follows :

'The court shall receive such additional amount for clerk hire as may be authorized by the county commissioners.'
