STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED FIFTY-FIVE

AN ACT Relating to Parking Meter Fines.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

R. S., c. 91, § 87, amended. Section 87 of chapter 91 of the revised statutes is hereby amended to read as follows:

'Sec. 87. Parking meters and charges; fines; use of revenue. The legislative body of any city and the inhabitants of any town may install parking meters on any street, public way or parking area and, establish reasonable charges for parking to be paid through such meters and set reasonable fines for parking in excess of the time paid for to such meters.

The revenue from the use of such meters shall be expended to finance the purchase, maintenance and policing of such meters or to maintain and improve streets and highways, or to acquire, construct, improve, maintain and manage public parking areas, or for any combination of the foregoing purposes, but for no purpose not expressly authorized herein.

The provisions of this section shall apply to parking meters already installed and to those which may be installed hereafter.'
