STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED FIFTY-FIVE

AN ACT Relating to the Digging of Clams in Freeport.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

P. & S. L., 1951, c. 207, § 1, amended. The 3rd sentence of section 1 of chapter 207 of the private and special laws of 1951 is hereby amended to read as follows:

'Nothing herein shall prohibit any inhabitant, or temporary resident or any riparian owner of shores or flats within said town, from digging or taking clams for food for himself and family without license; provided the amount so taken shall not be in excess of $\frac{1}{2}$ bushel per tide per preson.'
